## Men's Club Captain Report

### Review of 2020/21 season

Most of the teams had hit a run of form in their leagues when the season was called off early, with both the 1s and 2s unbeaten and top of their leagues. The 3s had been on a good run of form and found themselves in 3rd place. The 4s seemed to have been on a hangover from relegation from last season and took a few weeks to get going and had recorded back-to-back wins when the season stopped. The 5s were having a bit of a hit and miss season, losing a few games by just a single goal, and the 6s were starting to adjust to adult hockey, with back-to-back wins to finish off the season.

### First XI

A disappointing draw in the first game of the season was the low point of what would be considered a successful Division 1 campaign. Five wins in six games saw the 1XI top of the league after putting in some very impressive performances. The team's usual threat from penalty corners was still effective, but the team have improved the chances they have created from open play, and we hope they continue to improve next season under the leadership of Andy Round, Harry Carpenter and John Kirton.
