BSHC Junior Report 2017/18

We have had another very successful year of junior hockey with over 400 children playing competitive hockey every week. We have a fantastic group of coaches and assistants and without these people the sessions would not go ahead. We are currently running a few extra sessions to compensate for the bad weather in January, which everyone is enjoying. Please see below a brief summary for each age group.

U8 Mixed

The U8s training has been very popular again this year with over 45 children registered and over 30 regularly attending the sessions. The group is led by Pippa ably assisted this year again by Cuz and Ros, Scarlett, Hallie and Lawrence. Due to the numbers, and the experience of players that have been in the group for two years, after the initial introductory sessions the group was split into two; the more experienced or confident players working with Pippa and the younger group, some just 5 years old coached by Cuz and Ros. Hallie and Scarlett moved between groups supporting where needed depending on the numbers each week.

First and foremost, the training is fun, all-inclusive ensuring that all the children get a good first experience of hockey, learning the basic skills and a simple understanding of game play and rules. The more experienced players again this year had the opportunity to play in friendly games arranged with Blue Hornets and Old Loughts, which they all thoroughly enjoyed participating enthusiastically, applying their skills to 'real game' situations. The final session before Easter included the whole group playing games with Blue Hornets. The additional sessions provided this summer due to poor winter weather, have been well attended. The coaches look forward to seeing the players moving on and developing their skills further and welcoming many of the youngsters back in September.

Primary School Hockey

Pippa has been coaching in the Primary schools again this year as part of the Herts Schools Partnership offer. This year 10 schools signed up each being offered six hours of coaching. In some schools this would include two classes for three sessions, in the smaller schools the same class for 6. Approximately 480 pupils were coached, many taking part in the Quick Sticks tournament at the end of the Spring Term.

Pippa is also offering coaching for the Primary schools at the Birchwood Games on 2nd July, providing a further opportunity to promote the club across the schools in the town.

U10 Boys

The relatively small training squad for this age group was quite young, containing several U9s and not surprisingly lacked experience as a result. This showed in the early games where the boys were not that competitive against bigger, stronger and better opponents from other clubs. However, they worked hard in training to both develop their technical base and tactical understanding, whenever the harsh weather on Sunday mornings allowed.

The whole squad improved but several players started to pull away from the others in terms of their skills, competitiveness and understanding of match play. These then formed the core of a team that started to compete in their tournament games in the second half of the season.

Many of this year's group are U10 again next year and should form the basis of a team with some promise. There is still much to be done in terms of production of secure and repeatable technique and skills, as is expected for young players, but the enthusiasm and desire to train hard and improve shown by so many will help achieve that goal. The aim for the club must be to produce a larger squad with a
